

Objectives

During each semester, students will:

- learn to follow instructions given by the teacher in English
- express basic things about themselves in English through songs, stories, games and play
- develop their cognitive skills through activities that stimulate their thinking, logic and numeracy skills (such as matching, categorising, grouping and puzzles)
- develop fine and gross motor skills through movement, colouring, painting and sticking
- begin to develop their social skills through interaction with other children, pair and group work
- develop their creativity and imagination through arts and crafts

Attitudes

Students will also be encouraged to develop the following attitudes:

- enjoying the routine, songs, stories and class and activities
- interacting with other children
- developing polite behaviour towards others and respecting others
- enjoying group and individual work
- developing confidence in their own abilities
- participating in class and having a positive attitude towards English classes

Language areas

The course is designed in partnership with the Oscar® award-winning animators, Aardman, and is based on the memorable stories of Timmy Time. The topics are easy for the children to relate to, allowing them to map their real-world experiences to the language classroom and learn in a natural and engaging way.

The children will be introduced to thousands of words and phrases in English through play activities such as stories, songs, music, video, movement, arts and craft. They will be expected to show understanding of and produce with support language related to:

Assessment

There is no formal assessment for this age group, but the parents will have the opportunity to talk to the teacher during the Parents' Weeks (October and April) and will receive a written report (January and June), with the teachers' observations on the areas of *Communication and Language*, *Personal, social and emotional development* and *Physical development*.
